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KEY ETHICAL PRINCIPLES IN COUNSELING

- **JUSTICE:** THIS PRINCIPLE CALLS FOR FAIRNESS IN THE DISTRIBUTION OF RESOURCES AND SERVICES, ENSURING EQUAL ACCESS FOR ALL CLIENTS.
- **FIDELITY:** COUNSELORS ARE EXPECTED TO BE TRUSTWORTHY AND UPHOLD COMMITMENTS MADE TO CLIENTS.

THESE PRINCIPLES GUIDE COUNSELORS IN THEIR DECISION-MAKING PROCESSES, ENSURING THAT THEY MAINTAIN ETHICAL STANDARDS IN THEIR PRACTICE. BY ADHERING TO THESE PRINCIPLES, COUNSELORS CAN BUILD TRUST AND FOSTER A THERAPEUTIC ENVIRONMENT CONDUCTIVE TO HEALING AND GROWTH.

LEGAL FRAMEWORK GOVERNING COUNSELING PRACTICE

MANDATORY REPORTING LAWS

CULTURAL COMPETENCE AND ETHICAL PRACTICES

CULTURAL COMPETENCE IS INCREASINGLY RECOGNIZED AS A VITAL ASPECT OF ETHICAL COUNSELING. COUNSELORS MUST BE AWARE OF THEIR OWN BIASES AND UNDERSTAND THE CULTURAL BACKGROUNDS OF THEIR CLIENTS TO PROVIDE EFFECTIVE AND RESPECTFUL CARE. IMPORTANCE OF CULTURAL AWARENESS
