MEANWHILE, ANDREW REMAINS TIED TO THE LAND AND EVENTUALLY MARRIES RUTH, LEADING TO A COMPLEX WEB OF RELATIONSHIPS THAT HIGHLIGHT THEMES OF REGRET, UNFULFILLED DREAMS, AND THE PASSAGE OF TIME.

THEMATIC ANALYSIS

THESE CHARACTERS NOT ONLY DRIVE THE NARRATIVE FORWARD BUT ALSO SERVE AS VESSELS FOR O'NEILL'S EXPLORATION OF DEEP-SEATED EMOTIONAL AND EXISTENTIAL THEMES.

HISTORICAL CONTEXT

WRITTEN IN THE EARLY 20TH CENTURY, "BEYOND THE HORIZON" REFLECTS THE SOCIETAL CHANGES OCCURRING IN AMERICA DURING THAT TIME.
