1. CHARLES PERRAULT: A FRENCH AUTHOR WHOSE COLLECTION "TALES OF MOTHER GOOSE" INTRODUCED ICONIC STORIES LIKE "CINDERELLA" AND "SLEEPING BEAUTY."
2. THE BROTHERS GRIMM: JACOB AND WILHELM GRIMM COLLECTED AND PUBLISHED GERMAN FOLKTALES, INCLUDING "HANSEL AND GRETEL" AND "SNOW WHITE," WHICH EMPHASIZED DARKER THEMES COMPARED TO THEIR PREDECESSORS.
3. HANS CHRISTIAN ANDERSEN: A DANISH WRITER KNOWN FOR HIS ORIGINAL FAIRYTALES, SUCH AS "THE LITTLE MERMAID" AND "THE UGLY DUCKLING," WHICH OFTEN CONTAINED POIGNANT MORAL LESSONS.

FAIRYTALES FROM DIFFERENT CULTURES

- LITTLE RED RIDING HOOD: ORIGINATING FROM FRANCE, THIS TALE WARNS AGAINST THE DANGERS OF NAIVETY AND THE IMPORTANCE OF LISTENING TO PARENTAL GUIDANCE.
- THE FROG PRINCE: WITH ROOTS IN GERMANY, THIS STORY HIGHLIGHTS THE THEMES OF INNER BEAUTY AND THE SIGNIFICANCE OF KEEPING PROMISES.

ASIAN FAIRYTALES

ASIAN FAIRYTALES OFTEN INCORPORATE ELEMENTS OF SPIRITUALITY, NATURE, AND MORAL LESSONS REFLECTIVE OF THEIR

CULTURAL HERITAGE.

- THE TALE OF THE BAMBOO CUTTER: ALSO KNOWN AS "THE TALE OF PRINCESS KAGUYA," THIS JAPANESE FAIRYTALE TELLS THE STORY OF A BAMBOO CUTTER WHO FINDS A TINY GIRL INSIDE A STALK OF BAMBOO, EXPLORING THEMES OF BEAUTY AND IMPERMANENCE.
- THE MONKEY KING: FROM CHINESE FOLKLORE, THIS TALE FOLLOWS THE MISCHIEVOUS AND POWERFUL CHARACTER OF SUN WUKONG, EMBODYING THEMES OF REBELLION, LOYALTY, AND THE QUEST FOR ENLIGHTENMENT.
- THE WHITE SNAKE: A CHINESE LEGEND ABOUT A LOVE AFFAIR BETWEEN A HUMAN AND A SNAKE SPIRIT, THIS STORY DELVES INTO THEMES OF LOVE, SACRIFICE, AND THE SUPERNATURAL.

AFRICAN FAIRYTALES

AFRICAN FAIRYTALES OFTEN EMPHASIZE COMMUNITY VALUES, NATURE, AND THE IMPORTANCE OF STORYTELLING.

- ANANSI THE SPIDER: ORIGINATING FROM WEST AFRICAN FOLKLORE, ANANSI IS A TRICKSTER FIGURE KNOWN FOR HIS CLEVERNESS. HIS STORIES OFTEN IMPART MORAL LESSONS ABOUT WISDOM AND RESOURCEFULNESS.
- THE LION'S WHISKER: A TALE FROM ETHIOPIA, THIS STORY TEACHES LESSONS ABOUT BRAVERY, TRUST, AND THE IMPORTANCE OF FAMILY BONDS.
- THE TORTOISE AND THE HARE: THIS FABLE, COMMON ACROSS MANY CULTURES, EMPHASIZES THE VALUE OF PERSEVERANCE OVER ARROGANCE.

NORTH AMERICAN FAIRYTALES

INDIGENOUS CULTURES IN NORTH AMERICA HAVE THEIR OWN RICH TRADITIONS OF STORYTELLING, OFTEN FEATURING ANIMAL CHARACTERS AND NATURAL ELEMENTS.

- THE LEGEND OF THE DREAMCATCHER: A STORY ROOTED IN NATIVE AMERICAN CULTURE, IT TEACHES THE IMPORTANCE OF FILTERING OUT NEGATIVE DREAMS AND RETAINING POSITIVE ONES.
- HOW THE RAVEN STOLE THE SUN: A TALE FROM THE INDIGENOUS PEOPLES OF THE PACIFIC NORTHWEST, THIS STORY EXPLAINS THE ORIGINS OF LIGHT AND THE SIGNIFICANCE OF THE RAVEN AS A CREATOR FIGURE.

THEMATIC ANALYSIS OF FAIRYTALES

DESPITE THE DIVERSE ORIGINS OF FAIRYTALES, THEY OFTEN SHARE COMMON THEMES THAT RESONATE WITH AUDIENCES ACROSS CULTURES.

THE EVOLUTION OF FAIRYTALES
