- **MARY WOLLSTONECRAFT:** OFTEN REGARDED AS THE FIRST FEMINIST PHILOSOPHER, WOLLSTONECRAFT'S "A VINDICATION OF THE RIGHTS OF WOMAN" ADVOCATES FOR WOMEN'S EDUCATION AND RATIONALITY, LAYING A PHILOSOPHICAL GROUNDWORK FOR LATER FEMINIST THOUGHT.
- **ANGELA DAVIS:** AN ACTIVIST AND SCHOLAR, DAVIS INTEGRATES RACE, CLASS, AND GENDER INTO HER CRITIQUES OF THE PRISON-INDUSTRIAL COMPLEX AND SYSTEMIC OPPRESSION, ADVOCATING FOR A MORE INCLUSIVE FEMINIST MOVEMENT.

FEMINIST THEORETICAL FRAMEWORKS
